I am sure that everyone who is reading this now is Hail and Hearty. Everyone will be strictly following lockdown guidelines and social distancing.

We are passing through an unprecedented phase. We are living in such a crucial time that our students, either in Jammu and Kashmir in our Homes or studying outside in different cities, are facing lot of problems. Still we want them to have confidence in us that we are the people who are committed to care for them and will continue to support.

The outbreak of Covid-19 has made us to realize that how more important our work has become now for the children whose responsibility has been accepted by us. We must educate the children about facing the new range of unforeseen situation and challenges and how to remain undeterred. Of course our children have been living in the phase of fear and trauma due to militancy problem for the last 25 years but this year they faced different kind of situations and that also in same year. First due to a government decision on 5th of August 2019 when Article 370 was removed and the state came to almost complete halt. All the educational institutes were closed for about 3 months. Second Covid-19 has been proving dangerously disastrous not only in our country but globally. Though Jammu & Kashmir goes through bad patches every now and then but this year 2019-20 was absolutely very treacherous, full of disturbances and completely hopeless situation where darkness shadowed everyone's mind. This led to a complete darkness in the heart of everyone creating an atmosphere of hopelessness amongst the community at large.

Still we are trying our best to boost the confidence amongst our children and within society by continuing our services to them to maximum possible extent. Our staff of all the homes are giving online assignments to the children and helping them in their studies. Our ambulances are running all over Jammu and Kashmir in different places and serving to needy population. We are taking full care of food and healthy stay of our children who are taking professional courses outside J&K in different cities of India. We are continuously in touch of local authorities and college administration for their support in this lockdown condition. We are taking all the efforts to prevent any disturbance in their study and hindrance in their career.

We are sure that present situation will be improved today or tomorrow. These children of today are the future of tomorrow. So our prime duty is to protect them and make them robust to face such challenges in their life. Our all activities like educational programs, medical services, Ambulance project, Construction of Hostel at Jammu and other places and Udaan school etc. will be running continuously.

We are well experienced in working for the children, especially girls who have lost their parents in the violence. At present on one hand we are running 5 homes in the state of Jammu & Kashmir and outside taking care of more than 230 girls. On the other hand we are also running a network of 13 specialized Ambulances providing Emergency Medical Services to the needy population of the state. Regarding Construction of Hostel at Jammu for 300 children, RCC work 5th floor has been completed and further work is still going on. This year we have spread our wings in totally new area to serve special children and started a school namely "Udaan School" in Kupwara district. Everything has been accomplished according to the plan this year.

Borderless World Foundation (BWF): is a Non-Governmental, Non-Profit Organization, established on 8th March 2002 and registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 (BPT) with its registered office at Pune in the state of Maharashtra, Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) and section 80G of the Income Tax Act. BWF is also registered as a Charitable Trust in the State of Jammu & Kashmir with Trust Registration No. 57, with its registered office at Srinagar. BWF is working since late 1990s for rehabilitation and socio-economic empowerment of the poor and deprived sections of the society in general and women in particular, in the strife-torn valley of Kashmir. With strong belief in the values of compassion and respect for dignity of human beings, the organization strives for 'ONE GREAT HUMAN FAMILY' by working for the welfare of the affected population, ir-respective of caste, creed, religion, and political persuasion. The BWF family continues to move forward with a 'change-begins-with-me' approach for this social cause. With its prime focus on geographically remote and disadvantaged border areas, BWF launched its rehabilitation projects in the frontier districts of Kupwara, Beerwah, Anantnag, Srinagar and Jammu, with the hope to bring positive changes to more lives.

Introduction:

Change cannot be brought over night. It is slow and continuous process but once change starts it needs to be made sustainable. BWF started its journey with an aim to rehabilitate and empower orphan girls of the conflict torn valley of Jammu and Kashmir. But with the passage of time, BWF expanded its area and started providing assistance to all the sections of people in the valley as per the need of the hour. While taking you to the wonderful journey of BWF, you will start getting a glimpse of our achievements in different areas this year with your kind support:

- ◆ We reached out about 2500 families across the state of Jammu and Kashmir.
- ◆ Provided education to more than 700 orphan girls from these families.
- ◆ Ensured that these girls get the best education within the J&K territory as well as outside in different cities of India.
- ◆ Provided these girls the shelter, security and also ensured that they are provided best possible nutritious food for better and healthy lives.

Spread its wings in total new area, BWF started educational facility namely "Udaan School" for Special children of the society in Kupwara district this year.

Literally this year, has been a year full of different types of challenges. BWF has always been searching opportunities in such situations and improving its outreach. The valley faced almost five month's total closure and suspension of all the activities. Of course Kashmir valley has seen ups

and downs for the last 25 years and had become accustomed to it but this year problem was of different nature. First was due to change in the situation after removal of Article 370 on 5th August 2019 when total administration came to stand still position till October 2019. Then again schools were closed for three months due to winter vacation from December 2019 to February 2019. As activities were about to start, a deadly disease in the form of Covid-19 hit the country and till date the lockdown is enforced. The situation is like a war, a human crisis and we have to fight this pandemic in a well-planned way. The life again came to a standstill position till date.

BWF has taken new initiatives like running awareness program and distribution of Food packs to the needy population in remote areas in collaboration with Local Administration. All the children have been sent to their parents as per orders from government and BWF homes are closed now. However the staff is teaching the students online giving them assignments and getting them prepared for the exams to be held as soon as schools are reopened.

Thus by implementing new programs and initiatives and strengthening old ones, BWF is taking its legacy of 23 years forward with firm foot. We have also strengthened and streamlined our projects through regular monitoring, evaluation and timely decision. In times of crisis we always stood strong due to the whole hearted support and confidence of our beneficiaries, donors and well-wishers. In the year 2019-20, we saw many ups and down as well as moments of happiness and we would like to share these moments with you in the form of our annual happenings.

Providing shelter and education:

a. Project Basera-e-Tabassum (BeT):

The seed of BWF was sown way back in 1996-97 in the militancy effected area of Kashmir valley. Officially the project was started in 2002 with its first home for the orphan girls in Kupwara district of Kashmir. BWF started Basera-e-Tabassum (meaning abode of smiles), a



home to rehabilitate these conflict effected children and provide them with shelter, sense of security, healthcare and education. The aim behind the project was to educate them necessarily and help them to establish their own identity, making good human beings with ethical values and to empower them to become respectable citizens. Presently BWF is running four homes in the districts of Kupwara, Anantnag, Beerwah and Srinagar in the Kashmir valley.

Each home is well managed by a Manager, House Mother, experienced teachers with multi tasks, Cook and a Watchman. Above them there are Project Co-ordinators also for overall coordination and to Liaison with local administration. There are about 30-35 children in each Home.

b. Project FAH (Facilitate and Accomplish with Humility):

BWF started 'Project FAH', a home in Jammu for girl children who have so far lived in migrant camps in Jammu in 2009.

These children are mostly from Kashmiri Hindu families who were compelled to leave the valley due to unforeseen unavoidable circumstances about 30 years back. They were in camps and the condition became so precarious that these children were in state of immense fear and insecurity. They did not have any chance of development and good normal life left to uncertain future.



To give them confidence and to cope with the challenges it was utmost need of the hour to provide these children an environment of happiness having air of positivity. They needed residence with food, security and shelter on top priority and BWF rose to the occasion to provide them Home for education and development.

Both projects concentrate on overall development of children providing not only education but also take care of their health, physical fitness, hobbies, talents and personality development.

Over the years, most of the homes have had to move. Multiple times. Typically as the children grow in age and number. Or if the rent increases too much. Lately, the JJ Act has necessitated more transitions. So the data on number of rooms etc. could be obsolete soon.

Daily routines and schedules were not typical for most months in Kashmir because this was during Ramzan.

I recommend having a post-paid SIM while in J&K



These girls will be working for socio economic development of the society. They will also set examples for others girls and their parents to have faith and confidence in BWF and actively involved in social revolution. Development is a continuous process and Borderless World Foundation ensures that all

the children not only learn to survive but also progress and become self-sufficient. All the traveling, boarding and lodging as well as other expenses are borne by Borderless World Foundation.

Project – UDAAN (School for The Exceptional Children)

In September 2019, BWF took over its first school for the special children in the conflict area of Kupwara District of J&K . BWF has taken over the School to rehabilitate these children and provide them self-sufficiency, education, improved health and a better future. Our aim is to empower them to grow to be self-reliant for their own daily activities and lead a healthy and move towards normal life.



Borderless World Foundation (BWF) is a Pune based non-profit, N.G.O., working for rehabilitation and socio-economic empowerment of the poor and deprived section of the society in the strife-torn valley of Kashmir from the year 2002. We have provided the services of 14 ambulances, 5 orphanages and yearly specialty medical camps over the last 18 years.



Indian Army started an institute named 'Udaan School and Rehabilitation Centre' in 2010 as a school for special children located at Kupwara in Jammu & Kashmir. Recognizing and appreciating our sincere social work for needy children, In August, 2019, the school has been handed over to BWF,

It is estimated that there are thousands of special children in Kupwara district itself.

Keeping in view the welfare of these special children, BWF looks forward to run the school in an efficient way.

Our Thrust Areas –

Realizing that most of these Special Children generally are not cared and situation may worsen especially after the death of their parents / caretakers. They rather become a burden to the society, hence BWF is trying to enable them through the services provided at school.

OUR THRUST AREAS :

BWF recognizes that the development of the border areas is not possible without the participation of the local people and thus empowering the people is at the core of our activities.

- Rehabilitation of children (esp. orphans)
- Education
- Health care support

OUR PROJECT: BASERA-E-TABASSUM :

In May 2002, BWF established a home for the orphan girls in Kupwara district of Kashmir. Women and children are more vulnerable victims of violence and face destitution and abandonment. Violence in the Kashmir valley has resulted in thousands of widows and orphans. These abandoned children especially girls have been deprived of their childhood and are forced to take adult responsibilities. Basic education and health care is far-fetched dream for them. Their physical, psychological, social and economic well being has been affected enormously. Being orphan girls, they are targets of cultural and moral policing and discrimination. There are no homes or places of rehabilitation exclusively for girls. BWF believes that "Healing young children's wounds allows them to survive a war or a conflict. Healing their spirits may prevent the next war or a conflict." It is in this context that BWF started Basera-e-tabassum, (meaning abode of smiles), a home to rehabilitate these children and provide them with shelter, healthcare and education. The aim is to empower them to grow as independent human beings and lead healthy and creative lives. Bwf is running 3 homes in the three districts of the Kashmir valley.



PROJECT 'FAH' :

(Facilitate and Accomplish with Humility)

About The Project : In August, 2009 Borderless World Foundation started Project Fah, a Home in Jammu for girl children who have thus far lived in migrant camps in Jammu. These children belong to Kashmiri families (mostly Hindus) who had to leave the valley almost two decades ago because of the unfavorable conditions. Various studies conducted in migrant camps in Jammu have proven that life in migrant camps and the various constraints (space, financial, environmental etc.) that it brings about with itself have hampered the development of children living in them. Due to the difficult conditions at the Camps, the children are not able to learn and reach the best of their potential. To help them cope with the challenges of achieving despite the situation, it is important that these children get to live in an environment which is free from such negative influences and is conducive to their overall development- which only a residential facility away from the camp areas can provide. This is where BWF hopes to make a difference.



OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT :

- 1. Development :** To facilitate an integrated learning environment for the holistic development of children by providing educational opportunities and structured, activity-based learning
 - 2. Recreation :** To provide a space for children to unwind, have fun and explore their creative streak through various recreational activities
 - 3. Culture :** To make Kashmiri culture available to children through various day-to-day as well as special activities and events, to let them explore the option of getting back to their roots and learning things that they would have probably done had they been in Kashmir.
- BWF believes that safety, education, innocent and carefree childhood are the basic rights of all children. The girl-orphans are rehabilitated, recognizing children's rights passed by the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) namely- Rights to Survival, Rights to Protection, Rights to Development, Rights to Participation . In short, the aim is to work for the physical and psychological recovery and social reintegration of these children. At present BWF is running four homes in the districts of Kupwara, Budgam, Anantnag and Jammu with of 133 girls between the age group of 02 to 17yrs. These girls are pursuing their education in local, government & private schools.



HEALTH CARE SUPPORT :

- 1. Hospital On Wheels :**
Due to the poor availability of Emergency Medical Services in J&K, BWF conducted a survey in the frontier district of Kupwara in collaboration with the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai. Resultantly, BWF, along with the Directorate of Health Services, J&K provided four cardiac and trauma care ambulances in the valley in order to ensure timely transfer of patients requiring advanced medical treatment in tertiary-care hospitals in the state. The fully equipped medical care ambulances are stationed at Sangrama, Anantnag and Pampore in South Kashmir and Jammu. The gesture was launched and appreciated by Former Chief Minister of J&K, Late Mufti Mohammad Syeed.
- 2. Pediatric Care :**
BWF acts as a catalyst between the families in Kashmir and specialized hospitals outside the state in undertaking critical treatment of babies suffering from various ailments and sending them back when fully recovered.
- 3. Cure To Pellet Victims :**
The most recent project taken up by BWF was to coordinate with the best of ophthalmologists in the country including Padma awardee Dr. Natrajan and Dr. Shanmugam to perform surgeries on the victims suffering from severe eye injuries due to the use of pellet guns in the ongoing unrest in the valley. Chief Minister Mehbooba Mufti appreciated the efforts and expressed gratitude to BWF for their role of coordination.



WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CENTRE :

BWF believes in creating livelihood for women in conflict regions and making them independent and self-sufficient individuals in the society. We established acentrecalled 'Rah-E-Niswan' to carry out various business activities for the girls, which includes

- 1. Happy Choice :**
The use of sanitary napkins not being pervasive in the region and to make girls better aware about hygiene, BWF started with the production and marketing of 'Happy Choice- sanitary napkins' in the area which is solely run by the girls of the organisation. Moreover, the napkins are highly cost effective and environment friendly. 'Happy Choice' did not only receive recognition by winning the first prize in a business plan competition organised for the entrepreneurs of the Kashmir valley but also was figured among the top 10 plans in the competition organised by CHINAR International and Tata Institute of Social Sciences.
- 2. Design Your Own :**
We have trained our girls to work in the computer embroidery unit. The creations put out by the brand 'Design your own', started by our girls are aesthetically very expressive.
- 3. Tailoring & Fabric Painting :**
BWF has established a separate unit for tailoring and fabric painting for our girls. Bed sheets, pillow covers, Kashmiri suits are just some of the examples of their beautiful creations.

UDAAN – WINGS OF HOPE

Udaan School and Rehabilitation Centre is a School for people with Special Needs in Drugmulla, Kupwara District of Jammu and Kashmir. It was started by the Indian Army in 2010 and now handed over to us since September 2019.

We have taken over the School to rehabilitate these children and provide them self-sufficiency, education, improved health and a better future. Our aim is to empower them to grow to be self-reliant for their own daily activities and lead a healthy life and move towards normal life.

We are working for their physical and psychological recovery, further if possible, social reintegration of these children. At present, we have adopted this unique concept school in Drugmulla, Kupwara District. With the help of our generous donors we will extend it to other places in Kupwara, because as per survey conducted by Handicapped Association of Kashmir, there are more than 38000 disabilities in Kupwara District

So, Borderless World Foundation started Women Development Centre in Kupwara with set up various units - Embroidery, stitching, knitting, fabric painting and sanitary napkin. This center was not only a training center for girls and poor women of the society but also gave them employment and helped them to become financially independent. One of our senior advisor and trainer received prestigious award for working towards women empowerment from MAHA NGO Federation.



Construction of Hostel at Jammu

BWF is experiencing many difficulties in changing the rented accommodations frequently for various reasons causing lot of inconvenience to the children. Hence, we have decided to proceed ahead with construction of our own State of Art Homes with all modern infrastructural and education facilities. BWF has already purchased lands at Kupwara, Beerwah and Jammu for this purpose.

The construction of Jammu Home is already in progress. During this year the status of work is as follows:

1. RCC work up to 5th floor completed.
2. RCC work at all floors for weather projections & architectural projections in progress.
3. RCC Underground Water Tank work is in progress.
4. Brick work completed 80% for all external walls and 90% for all internal walls.
4. External plumbing work is in progress.
5. Internal Wall Plaster work completed for 1st floor.





UDAAN School

Recently BWF has spread its wings in new area. It has taken over a school for special children from Army some time back in Kupwara district. As per reports there are about 30000 special children in Kupwara district alone. At present there are 30 children of 6-28 years age group in the school with 5 teachers. Students are from different category namely mentally retarded, physically challenged and deaf & dumb. The aim to start this school is to bring special children into main stream of society and prepare them to live a respectable life like other normal children. This school was closed for 3 months till 1st March 2020 due to severe cold in winter season. Due to present situation of Covid-19, in the lockdown, the school has been declared closed as per orders from Administration.

Taking the benefit of 3 month's winter holidays, 3 teachers of Udaan School got 2 month's Training in Padsad Karnabhadhir Vidyalaya, Prabodhini School and Sunanda Vidya Mandir at Nasik. They have completed their training and went back to Kashmir on 3rd March 2020 and now waiting for the reopening of the school.

Way back to Kashmir on **5th March 2020** – Ms.Khalida, Ms.Nilofer and Ms.Ulfat got short Training at **Asha school, Delhi** in co-ordination with Shri Ram Nivas from Army. They got introduced with Doctor's Therapy software for Speech and Hearing Impairment.





Training Reports by the UDAAN Teachers

(hearings from last one month)

(1) Observations:

In hostel as well as in class room I observe all the things. In hostel, I observe things like how to manage a hostel. All the staff works in the hostel are top mind heard especially Sujata ma'am. She treats all the children like her or his own mother. I observe all the children's behaviour also.

In class room I observe things like how to behave with special child and I observe what kind of teaching aid teacher uses in class room.

(2) Information regarding hearing aids

Hearing aids are of two types one is analog type and second one is digital. Digital hearing aid has better features than analog type.

(3) Information regarding hearing losses

- Losses are of three types. (1) conductive loss - Probs from middle ear or outer ear.
 (ii) sensorinal loss - cochlea, nerve or hair cells.
 (iii) mixed loss - middle - inner - outer.

(4) Audio-metry. it is the process in which we can measure a person's ability to hear different sounds or frequencies. And I can do it now.

or we can say it is actually the ear test in which we are able to know person's ability to hear.

(3)

(10) we can train our children in sports also because I already observe they have ability and I hope they will do best. In Padsad school I got all the tips how to train children in sports.

(11) Hearing aids are very useful for our children I think they can listen and can also speak if we provide them hearing aid. we need almost 6 pair of hearing aids still date in Udaan.

(12) Audiogram:- I can do audiogram also it is actually the process in which we can get the percentage of hearing I mean how much per-cent a child can hear.

(13) chart making:- I learn how to make charts which we can use in our class room.

(14) Flash card making:- I can also make flash cards and can use them in my class.


Workshop of BWF Officials

In the year 2019, they had visited Kashmir and conducted various workshops under Dream India Camp. They conducted a 3 day workshop in BWF Basera-e-Tabassum Home of Kupwara for the children studying in 8th-12th class of our Kupwara and Srinagar Home. Based on this workshop, they selected above four girls, whom they invited for their Annual Retreat Programme in Vadodara.

We got very good experience about children needs and how to go ahead with their talent improvement program.
